



Male/ female ratio NLLAP meetings 2013










2013 NLLAP participants present at previous NLLAP



Organisation of 2013NLLAP participant was represented by someone else in previous NLLAP




2013NLLAP participants planning to come to next NLLAP meeting

Reasons for participation on the Platform


Reasons for participation in the 2013 NLLAP meetings






Total number of participants in range and attendance plans

Number of participants at 2013 NLLAP meetings




% of participants of 2013 NLLAP meetings planning to attend in the next NLLAP meeting
