### 3.0 CWSA Team

The CWSA Team then took their turn to express their profound gratitude to SNMA for organizing the first meeting of the DLAP and had them informed to participate. The team further threw more light on the core mandate of CWSA through its establishment Act 564, authorities it "to facilitate the provision of safe water and related sanitation services to rural communities and small towns" A key function of CWSA is providing technical assistance to MMDAs implementation of water and sanitation projects.

This brief introduction set the tone for the discussions. A question was asked by the CWSA rep on how the DWSP is drawn?

The MCD answered by saying it is drawn from the MTDP. Even though DWSP has not been updated, there are activities in the 2014-2017 MTDP of the Assembly which is being implemented

How does Assembly fund activities in the DWSP?

MCD answered again to say that, during the preparations of composite budgets for the Assembly, WS is budgeted for and also there is a Project in the Municipality called RING has one of her components on WASH. Some funds are drawn from that component to support the activities of DWSP.

The CWSA Team then informed the house that, there was a baseline data collected for all the districts in Ghana. So anyone who needs data can contact CWSA offices in the Regions

The MCD also said, the new DPCU has been expanded to include non-centralised departments. These include; Media, TA etc. he agreed that, this will make the DPCU very reach in ideas and planning

### **Water Board Issues**

Diare, Nanton and Pong-Tamale are not functioning. They have rejected any support the Assembly offers them. An example is there recent recruitment of staff for Pong-Tamale and they rejected and threaten the staff. So they left their office for the dear lives.

According to the Director as of the time of the meeting, their facilities are broken down but they cannot approach the Assembly for support

It is only Savelugu which is working and has a good structure in place and seeks support often from the Assembly

Savelugu Water Board Chairman then told the house that, due to their hard work he as the Chairman has participated in International Conferences on water and he had the occasion to host International Visitors from East Africa to come and learn how they manage their facility. He then went on the offer his support to Diare, Pong-Tamale and Nanton Water Boards.

5.0 WASH ISSUES IN Ghana Education Service

Access is very bad in our schools. Most of the schools do not water on the school compounds.

Pupils will have to walk long distances to get water for Ghana School Feeding Programme.

UNICEF contracted a private person to connect water to a few schools in Savelugu town without the knowledge of MA, GES. But all these have been disconnected.

Water Board Chairman reacted by saying they were not informed of such an activity. So when it was detected, all the lines were disconnected.

The meeting ended with a call again from the CWSA Team requesting that, another meeting be held immediately to get all the players in the Water Sector in the Municipality make a PowerPoint presentation on their issues. It is evident that, there are so many issues the Assembly is not aware.
