7	WASH Session during PTA meeting	Parents and Teachers	20 mins	Once a term	Advocacy sessions on School WASH to get support to activities/actions as well as reports on progress.
8	WASH Session during SMC Meeting	School Management Committee (SMC)	20 mins	Once a term	Advocacy sessions on School WASH to get support to activities/actions as well as reports on progress. Also to enlist group support to School Health Club activities as well as individual support as club patrons.

A Document which provides Guidelines for the formation and management of School Health Clubs

□ Target Users

Targeted at School Authorities to guide the formation and management of School Health Clubs

Purpose

To ensure that pupils are guided to play active roles in issues concerning their health whilst they are in school

School Health Clubs

- Will be formed in all Basic Schools Across the country
- Membership is Voluntary (open to all pupils).
- Membership not Limited to any number of pupils.
- Objectives of the Club:
 - —To promote hygienic lifestyles amongst pupils
 - -To increase pupils knowledge and understanding of WASH issues
 - -To promote health school environment
 - -To encourage outreach to home and community
 - —To challenge children to take up leadership roles and responsibilities

School Health Club

- □ Clubs will be set up following a 5 Step Process:
 - Awareness creation with Staff & Pupils
 - Announce the Formation
 - Register Members
 - Announce First Meeting
 - Conduct First Meeting
- School based Health Coordinators and their Assistants will be Patrons. Each Club will have five Executive members.

School Health Clubs

- □ Clubs will hold Weekly Activity Meetings during the school term (Calendar of Activities will be drawn for each term)
- Activity Areas (Skills based Health Education, Disease Prevention & Control, Safe and Health School Environment) Activities will all be co-curricula.

Support Mobilisation for Triggering

Will develop Defecation Area Map and analyse defecation practices

Will develop Action Plan towards achieving ODF
